

Trust complete a monthly restraint and seclusion report which is discussed within the organisation. There is a use of the safety cross on Maple Ward where we also collect this data which can be seen at a glance. Trends are identified and as a team, we were together to make changes to improve practice. We are currently part of the mental health improvement program and are working on reducing restrictive practices. Policies are also being reviewed so they coincide with the Use of Force Act.
